## **Campus News...Welcome to the Lancer Lounge!**



At Lamoille Union Middle and High School Library for the 2022-2023 school year, we created a new creativity space. With help from our facilities crew and support from our administration, the library staff created a space in the library set aside for students to be creative and take a moment for themselves. The students even chose the name themselves through a very extensive voting process (some name suggestions were: Creative Station for Imagination, Creative Fortress, Serenity Space, The Citadel, The Shire, The Georges Bizet Creative Space...we've got some

very creative students)! While being a space for making, it is also a low-tech space, focused on students disconnecting from devices and connecting with their peers or with whatever they are working on.





One of the tables in the space is a sensory table. It has various items for students to touch, smell, and manipulate, like kinetic sand, Play-Doh, and fidgets. Our other table is a Lego table, featuring lots of Legos from generous donations by our school community. We also

have Keva planks available, which are uniform, pine planks that are great for building. Students have enjoyed these tables and have built some great creations this year.



The crafting stations feature a button maker which has been very popular with middle and high schoolers alike. Students can create their own designs from templates or can use what has already been printed out. We have fuse beads, yarn and looms, jewelry-making supplies, beads, fasteners, rainbow looms, and a Cricut for cutting out shapes and letters. We even have a tea station! This space also features lots of art supplies

for any student to use. Students can come to the library for paper, paint, stickers, glue, tape, coloring supplies, poster board, hot glue, and more. This way, when working on projects, students have what they need.

The Lancer Lounge has been a great addition to our library this year and we have loved watching the students take ownership of it as they strive to use it responsibly and to keep it clean for others in their school community, while also enjoying themselves and creating. We look forward to building upon what we have and changing it as our students' interests and needs change. Please feel free to visit the Lancer Lounge!
